Calling All Female on October 3rd at the Rothman Forum. **Entrepreneurs!**

Female entrepreneurs in the USA now number nearly 38% of all US businesses, according to US Small Business Administration statistics. This percentage is expected to increase; yet female entrepreneurs often tend to work in isolation, particularly at the start-up stage, and do not readily have access to more established supportive networks such as those available to their male counterparts.

The Rothman Institute wants to reach out to these entrepreneurs. To this end the center has embarked on hosting a series of seminars aimed at female entrepreneurs in New Jersey. "The main objective is to provide a location where female entrepreneurs in the Morris County area will find an avenue to network amongst themselves, providing both professional and emotional support, said Dr. Ethné Swartz, a professor at the Institute and founder of the program.

A secondary aim of the initiative is to provide such entrepreneurs with the opportunity to access speakers on issues affecting business in general, and female entrepreneurship specifically. The Female Entrepreneurs' Networking Group will provide a basis for females to explore access to useful resources surrounding them.

This first seminar on 'Financial Fitness' was led by Marnie Aznar, MBA, CFP, an adjunct faculty member in Finance. The seminar considered issues such as how to do an audit of your financial situation and how to set financial goals, how to gain control over debt, how to monitor your credit history and how to set a budget and achieve savings goals.

Seminars will be held on Wednesday evenings, commencing at 6 pm in the Rothman Forum. As the 2002 seminar series is being planned, much audience input is being sought. "We will address the topics that female entrepreneurs or women considering self-employment feel they need," said Dr. Swartz.
